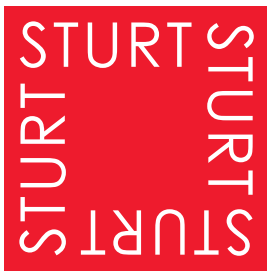
Weaving stripes is fundamental to creating a patterned or coloured woven cloth. Stripes can be horizontal in the weft or vertical in the warp; regular or irregular; wide or narrow, in muted, graduated or bold colours; contrasting, harmonious or jarring; organized or random; balanced or unbalanced; textured, looped, flat or plain; and woven with synthetic or natural materials and yarns – the interpretations are endless. Stripes are an excellent way to learn to weaving and to expand your weaving knowledge. Explore the options through sampling and then work on a finished piece that reflects your experimentation and interest.

Liz Williamson's weaving practice is diverse: designing for industry; exhibition artwork; production weaving of wraps and scarves in her Sydney studio; teaching weaving workshops nationally and internationally; and more recently engaged with artisan groups in India. At the heart of her weaving practice, is an interest in innovative, experimental and unusual designs created at the loom and teaching weaving. Liz is also Associate Professor at UNSW Art & Design, UNSW, Sydney.

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MATERIALS LIST

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Please bring with you:

- Loom - if you have a table loom or small loom, please bring to the workshop. If not there are excellent 4 and 8 shaft table looms in the Sturt Weaving room that can be used.
- Weaving accessories eg warping board, shuttles, bobbins, bobbin winder etc. Please bring if you have these; if not some will be provided.

All essential

- Accessories – scissors, pens, notebook, tape measure, calculator, pins, needles, tapestry needles.
- Yarns – please bring a selection of yarns that you are interested in weaving with. Yarns can be cotton, silk, wool, rayon, nylon, flat, textures, natural or synthetic or yarn made of any fibre that you can source. Bring yarns of any size, thickness, texture or colour. Bring a variety of colours, types and thickness of yarns. All can be used for weaving stripes.
- Materials – aside from yarns, bring other materials you are interested in weaving with eg fabric, paper, fine metal, leather, plastic, recycled materials. All can be used for weaving stripes.
- Re used materials – the workshop will allow you to experiment with a variety of reused, repurposed and recycled materials so please bring a selection of materials that you are interested in. For example these can be - paper and fabrics that can be cut / ripped into strips for weaving; old clothes, old household materials, gifted fabrics, old prints, photos or drawings; fine metal wire that is flexible enough for weaving; plant materials can be used for wefts; leather lacing, cord or braids.
- Bring a cup for morning tea.
