Learn to create images from wood veneers using a scalpel to cut out and place components to form a picture. In marquetry, the design is applied to a prepared base material unlike inlay, where the decorative designs are let into a solid item for embellishment.

There will be a choice of projects depending on your skill level. The course will also include discussions on understanding timber veneers, grain, texture, colour and ways of preparing veneers for use in marquetry and techniques such as sand shading. **No previous experience is needed** for this hands-on course and students will each complete their own project.

Leo Huyghebaert arrived in Australia in 1962 after completing a furniture apprenticeship in Belgium. He has run his own furniture business, which specialises in marquetry, for over 30 years. His sons now carry on the tradition and Leo is called on to complete special projects. Leo now concentrates on teaching and creating his own art works in marquetry.

The Summer School runs for 5½ days between Monday 4th and Saturday 9th January and the classes are held from 9am to 4.30pm (12.30 on Saturday). Tea and coffee are provided.
